"The legislation would establish English as the official language, require government functions to be conducted in English, and introduce an English-language testing standard for naturalization."

"It's time to make it a national policy."

Just 2 States Offer Driver's License Exams Only In English



Just 2 states out of 50 in the USA now offer their driver's license exams only in English.

The 2 states that offer their driver's license exams only in English are South Dakota and Wyoming.

The 48 other states offer their driver's license exams in a wide variety of other languages beyond English.

California is the state that offers its driver's license exams in the most languages, as it has 32 different language options available. Massachusetts ranks 2nd by offering its driver's license exams in 26 different languages.
