1. Generally speaking, do you feel things in this country are going in the right direction or have they gotten off on the wrong track?

42% Right Direction
52% Wrong Track
6% Not sure

2. Is English the official language of the U.S. government?

81% Yes
14% No
6% Not sure

3. Would you support or oppose a law that made English the official language of the U.S. Government?

54% Strongly support
19% Somewhat support
11% Somewhat oppose
10% Strongly oppose
7% Not sure

4. Over time, do you think that America will become more English-speaking or less English-speaking? Or will it stay about the same?

32% More English-speaking
20% Less English-speaking
43% It will stay about the same
5% Not sure

5. Over President Donald Trump signed an executive order last week making English the official language of the United States for the first time ever. Do you approve or disapprove of this executive order?

48% Strongly approve
17% Somewhat approve
10% Somewhat disapprove
18% Strongly disapprove
6% Not sure

6. Does President Trump signing the executive order make you more likely or less likely to support him?

37% More likely
30% Less likely
30% It does not make much difference
2% Not sure

7. Should election ballots and other official government documents be printed in English only or should they also be printed in other languages?

44% Printed in English only

48% Printed in other languages
8% Not sure

8. Should English become the primary official language of Puerto Rico, as part of any proposed Puerto Rico statehood bill?

29% Yes
45% No
26% Not sure

9. Generally speaking, would you prefer the US increase legal immigration, decrease legal immigration, or keep the level of legal immigration about the same?

25% Increase immigration
33% Decrease immigration
36% Keep it about the same
7% Not sure
