ProEnglish Praises President Trump's Official English Executive Order

Ever since President Bill Clinton left office, ProEnglish has worked to replace his multi-language Executive Order for the federal government with an Executive Order repealing it and replacing it with official English for government operations.

We salute President Donald Trump for issuing Executive Order 14224. The following are excerpts:

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, it is hereby ordered:

From the founding of our Republic, English has been used as our national language. Our Nation's historic governing documents, including the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution, have all been written in English. It is therefore long past time that

English is declared as the official language of the United States. A nationally designated language is at the core of a unified and cohesive society, and the United States is strengthened by a citizenry that can freely exchange ideas in one shared language.

In welcoming new Americans, a policy of encouraging the learning and adoption of our national language will make the United States a shared home and empower new citizens to achieve the American dream. Speaking English not only opens doors economically, but it helps newcomers engage in their communities, participate in national traditions, and give back to our society.

This order recognizes and celebrates the long tradition of multilingual American citizens who have learned English and passed it to their children for generations to come.

To promote unity, cultivate a shared American culture for all citizens, ensure consistency in government operations, and create a pathway to civic engagement, it is in America's best interest for the Federal Government to designate one — and only one — official language. Establishing English as the official language will not only streamline communication but also reinforce shared national values, and create a more cohesive and efficient society.

Accordingly, this order designates English as the official language of the United States.

Senator Bernie Moreno Sponsors the English Language Unity Act of 2025



“It is a welcome move that U.S. Senator Bernie Moreno has come forward to codify into law President Trump’s Executive Order stipulating English as the official language of government.” says Executive Director Ellen Hamilton-Cotten.

Born in Bogota Columbia, Moreno proudly became a citizen of the United States at the age of eighteen after moving here with his parents at just five years old.

Before entering politics, the Senator had a highly successful career but after selling most of his business, he began to focus on what he believes is his calling: protecting the American dream for another generation.

“JD Vance was right – English is the official language of the United States and, as one of the only naturalized citizens serving in the Senate, I should know,” said Moreno. Endorsed by President Trump, the Ohio Senator was elected to Vance’s Senate seat after Vance was chosen to be the President’s running mate.

Moreno continues to strongly lead the efforts to have English as the official language of the United States, by sponsoring the English Language Unity Act (S542).

In the U.S. House of Representatives, Congressman Robert Aderholt of Alabama is also sponsoring English language legislation.

 - 7% Not sure

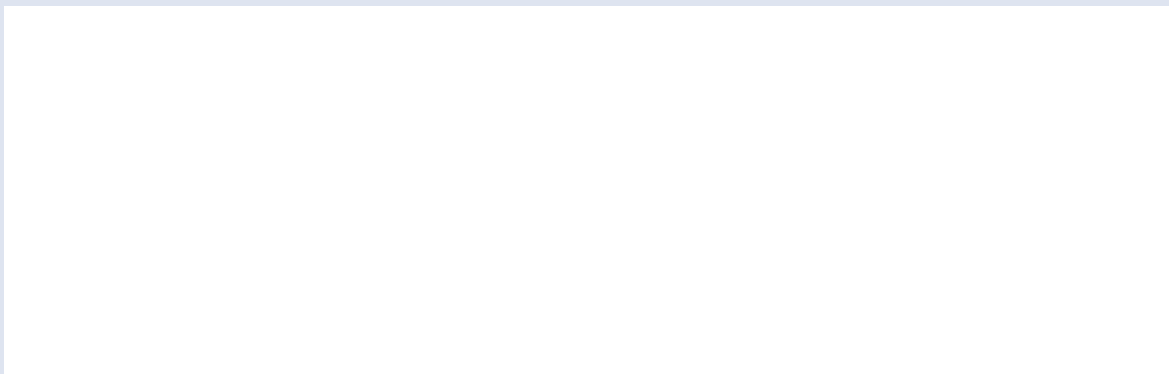
3. Over time, do you think that America will become more English-speaking or less English-speaking? Or will it stay about the same?
